

National Insurance Number



Why do you need one?

Your National Insurance Number is used as your unique reference number for the UK social security system throughout your life. It helps HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) make sure your tax and National Insurance contributions are recorded against your name.

If you're moving to the UK

You may have a National Insurance (NI) number printed on the back of your biometric residence permit (BRP). You don't need to apply for a National Insurance number if you already have one, or one is printed on your BRP.

If you don't have a National Insurance number, you must apply. You can only apply for it once you're in the UK. You must have the right to work or study in the UK to get a National Insurance number.

Bills to consider



Please click on the orange text for more detailed information

- <u>Council Tax</u>: Money earned through council tax goes towards local services such as policing, fire services, support for the elderly and vulnerable, parks maintenance, refuse disposal and street cleaning. Each council is responsible for allotting the funds as it sees fit.
- Water Bill: Water will cost you, according to Water UK, on average, £405 a year, or £33.75 a month in 2018/19.
- Gas and Electric Bills:
- **Average** Gas bill Flats with one or two bedrooms will get an average gas bill of £33 per month, or £392 a year.
- **Average** Electricity bill A one or two bedroom flat will spend just £34 per month on electricity, or £403 a year.
- Broadband: A type of high-speed internet connection.
 Broadband packages come in all shapes and sizes, depending on what you would like.

- TV Licence: A TV Licence costs £150.50 for the year. You must have a TV Licence if you:
- Watch or record programmes on a TV, computer or other device as they're broadcast.
- Download or watch BBC programmes on iPlayer live, catch up or on demand.

Considering purchasing your own property?

- <u>Service Charge</u>: You pay this to the freeholder of your <u>leasehold</u> <u>property</u> or to a managing agent to cover the upkeep of communal areas in a block of flats. If you're not sure how much your service charge is, check your lease for the amount. If you're renting, the service charge is normally included in the rent.
- Ground Rent: This is an annual amount that you pay if you own
 a leasehold property. Most flats and maisonettes are leasehold
 properties. It's usually a small amount (such as £100 or £200 a
 year). If you're not sure how much you pay, check your lease
 for the amount.






Storing personal items

Pets



Overview of bringing your pet cat, dog or ferret to the UK

You can enter or return to the UK with your pet cat, dog or ferret if it:

- has been <u>microchipped</u>
- has a <u>pet passport or third-country official veterinary certificate</u>
- has been <u>vaccinated against rabies</u> it will also need a blood test if you're travelling from an '<u>unlisted country</u>'

Dogs must also usually have a <u>tapeworm treatment</u>.

Your pet may be <u>put into quarantine</u> for up to 4 months if you do not follow these rules - or refused entry if you travelled by sea. You're responsible for any fees or charges.

You must follow extra rules if the animals will be:

- old in the UK from outside the EU or inside the EU
- rehomed in the UK from <u>inside or outside the EU</u>

Bringing other animals

The rules are different if you're <u>bringing other animals into the</u> UK.
